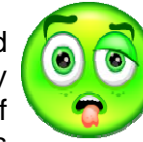

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Sick children (and staff)

A reminder to please not send your child to school if they are noticeably sick. We now have a large number of staff who are not able to attend school as they are too sick to teach classes. This is putting a huge drain on our school as we need to replace permanent teachers with casual staff as much as possible. It is however becoming harder to replace teachers as casual teachers are now also becoming sick. This could mean that classes will need to be split throughout the school as we are not able to cover them with teachers.



Connecting To Country

Mr Maher, Miss Jarvis and Mr Daniels travelled to Tingha yesterday and joined teachers, Elders and local Indigenous personnel to discuss local Tingha history, view sites such as the Rock Woman and the site of the old Mission and discuss differences between Welcome to and Acknowledgement to Country. Today the Tingha and Inverell crews travelled to Tenterfield to view Mt McKenzie and Bluff Rock and discuss local Tenterfield history. Tomorrow we will all travel to Inverell and view important sites in the Inverell area. There will also be a follow up 2 day course on June 18 and 19 to finish off this Professional Learning.



Country Areas Program (CAP)

Tomorrow 3/4M will be involved in a CAP course called 'The Thinking Brain'. This will be run at school by consultants who travel to Tenterfield along with students and teachers from other schools. Here they will learn some functions of the brain, discuss what is good for our brain (eg foods and a healthy lifestyle) and dissect a sheep's brain. On Thursday, 5/6C will also be involved in the same course which is also being run at our school. We are extremely lucky to be involved in these courses and be able to send so many students to them.

Wintersong Parade/March

The school has been asked to participate in the Wintersong Parade to be held on Saturday, June 23. This will start at the Royal Hotel and finish at the showgrounds with floats and different organisations joining in. We would like as many students as possible to join us on this day. This will not be like the ANZAC Day march, students can skip, walk, hop, wave and generally have a good time. **School uniform will not be worn on this day, instead**

students are asked to wear brightly coloured clothing to match the themes of the day. Students will be asked to meet at the back of the Royal Hotel around 12:10pm to start at 12:30pm.

Crunch and Sip and Health Message

Fruit Salad... Yummy Yummy!

Fruit salad is a great idea for Crunch&Sip*, full of colour, flavour and nutrients.

Why not chop up your child's favourite fruit and pop it into a sealable container. Don't forget a fork!



COLDS and FLUS

The new solution to help stop the spreading of colds is to **cough to your elbow (the inside) NOT into your hand**. We often cough into our hands, forget to wash them then touch everything (books, balls, computers etc). If we cough into our elbows we aren't usually rubbing our elbows onto anything.

Also, instead of sniffing all the time, encourage your child to blow their nose. Not only does this help them to breathe better but also helps avoid future hearing and inner ear complications. To avoid colds and flus remember to eat lots of fruit and vegetables, drink lots of water, exercise, get 20 minutes of sun a day and have adequate sleep (children aged 5-12yrs should have about 10-12 hours and adults 6-8 hours).

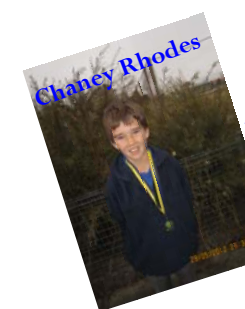
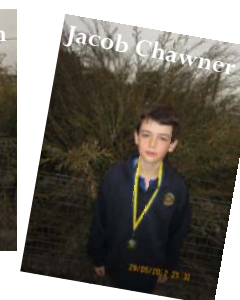
