Wearing Uniform to School Is Cool!

Book club has been handed out and is due back to the front office **by 9am on Friday Oct 28**

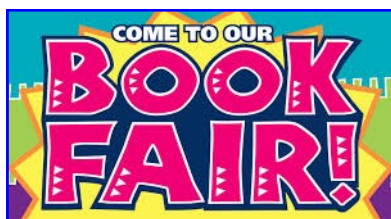
