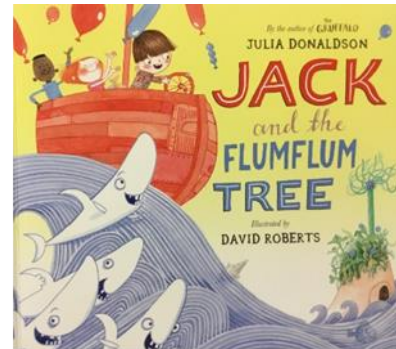
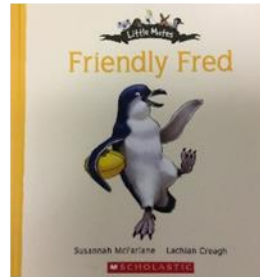
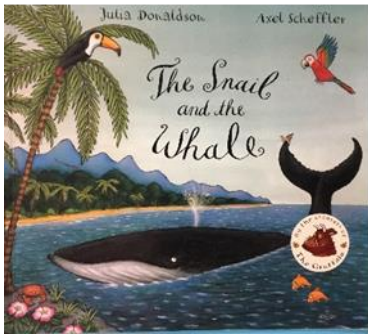
LEARNING SAFETY RESPECT

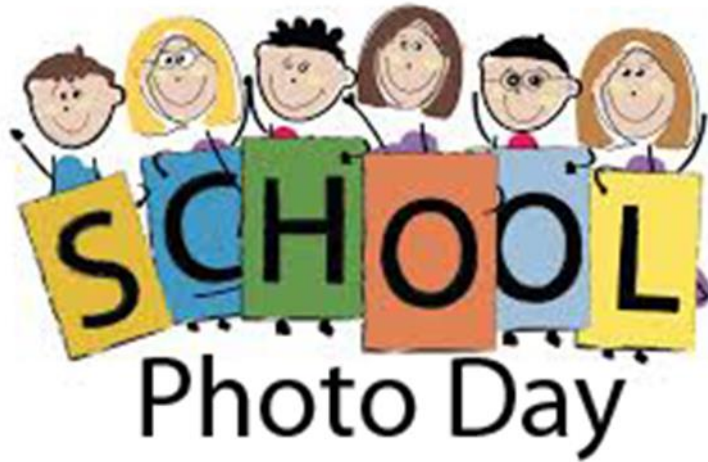
