It's a wonderful selection of engaging and affordable books for every reading level.

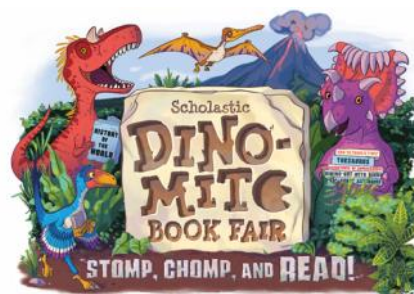
Please make plans to visit our Book Fair and be involved in shaping your child's reading habits.
