#### **Tell Them From Me Surveys**

This term students in Years 4-6 are invited to participate in the Tell Them From Me surveys.

The *Tell Them From Me* student survey asks questions about factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other outcomes. It aims to help improve the learning outcomes of students. The survey is designed to measure, assess and report insights from the student point of view at the school and system levels.

The focus of this NSW survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. The *Tell Them From Me* student survey will provide school principals and school leaders with insight into student engagement, wellbeing and effective teaching practices at their school, from the perspective of students.

Data collected from the survey responses are quickly compiled into reports for school leaders. Principals can then use this information to help them identify emerging issues and plan for school improvement. The survey typically takes less than 30 minutes and is conducted entirely online through a secure website operated by the survey developers, *The Learning Bar*. Staff in schools will not be able to identify individual students from their responses. To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password.

This survey is not compulsory. If you do not wish for your child to participate in the survey please contact the front office.

#### From the Assistant Principal's Desk..

#### What's Happening in Stage 2 and 3 Classrooms..

It was fantastic to see so many happy, smiling faces last week for the return of full time teaching. It was a joy to see and hear the excitement and to see children catching up with their friends. We are lucky to have such a caring school community.

This term in English, all 3 - 6 classes are looking at point of view and how this impacts on the information told. The best example we came up with was when we fight with brothers and sisters and how there are always different sides to the story! Students in Years 5 and 6 will be extending this knowledge to help them determine the validity of information and how the author can bias an opinion.

The point of view work fits nicely with out history units. Stage 2 are doing the First Fleet and have been looking at writing from the point of view of a convict. They have been learning about the harsh conditions and what life would have been like on the ships coming from England. Stage 3 are studying the impacts on minority groups since Federation and the point of view of these different groups.

In maths, we will continue to work through key skills such as addition, subtraction and fractions. A great way to support maths learning at home is to continue to do rote counting drills, starting from different numbers and counting by different increments. Please also remember to count backwards at the same time as forward and backward counting should be at the same place.

In other learning areas we are doing music and athletics. The music unit involves not just singing but also analysing pieces of music for the techniques used. Do you know what an ostinato is? In PE, we will continue to refine our athletics skills and the correct techniques for different field events.

#### <u>Camps</u>

At this stage, the Stage 2 camp to Evans Head will go ahead as planned. All children are still eligible to attend as the initial note was due for return during the time students were not required to be at school. A new note will be issued next week with the amount owing for each child.

Stage 3 camp to Brisbane has been rescheduled to November 3. A new permission note was issued today. All students will need to return this new note to cover the change of date. This note also included how much each child still has to pay.

## 1. What is the *Tell Them From Me* student survey?

The *Tell Them From Me* student survey asks questions about factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other outcomes. It aims to help improve the learning outcomes of students. The survey is designed to measure, assess and report insights from the student point of view at the school and system levels. The focus of this NSW survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

## 2. What kind of questions will the survey ask?

## 3. How have schools been selected to take part?

The survey is open to all NSW government schools at no cost to them. Your child's school has decided to participate.

## 4. How will taking part in this survey benefit my child's school?

The Tell Them From Me student survey will provide school principals and school leaders with insight into student engagement, wellbeing and effective teaching practices at their school, from the perspective of students.

Data collected from the survey responses are quickly compiled into reports for school leaders. Principals can then use this information to help them identify emerging issues and plan for school improvement.

## 5. What does my child need to do to participate in the survey?

The survey typically takes less than 30 minutes and is conducted entirely online through a secure website operated by the survey developers, *The Learning Bar.* Schools will make computers or laptops available so that students can complete the survey during school hours.

#### 6. Does my child have to participate?

No, participation in the survey is optional. Your child will not take part if either you or your child do not wish. If, during the survey, your child is uncomfortable, he/she can choose to stop the survey at any time. The majority of questions in the survey can be skipped. Parents/students have a right to apply for access to, and correction of, a student's information.

## 7. Will the school be able to identify my child from their responses?

Staff in schools will not be able to identify individual students from their responses. To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password. Where fewer than five students respond to a question, the results will not be made available.

A small number of staff in the department's Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation (CESE) will have access to individual student responses for the purpose of state-wide analysis. Individual students' data will be held on a secure server with access strictly limited to CESE researchers. The researchers are interested in trends only – not in individual student responses. No student will be identified in any publication. No school will be identified unless they have given permission.

#### 8. What sort of analysis will be done on the survey data?

Once the surveys are completed by students, reports are prepared and in most cases are available to schools within three business days. School leaders can use the data to better understand the experiences and views of students at their school.

CESE will undertake state-wide analysis of the survey data in conjunction with existing student data held by the department, including performance data.

The results will help all schools better understand the relationship between wellbeing, engagement, effective teaching and student learning. Results from CESE's analysis of this data will also help teachers and principals discuss what works to improve student outcomes. This supports the department's continuing focus on quality teaching and leadership. The data will be retained for future analysis to help us better understand the nature of student engagement and wellbeing over time.

#### 9. Can all school students participate in the survey?

The primary school survey is designed for students in Years 4 to 6. Schools are encouraged to allow as many students as possible in these year groups to participate. Secondary schools are encouraged to allow as many students as possible in Years 7 to 12 to participate.

## 10. When will the *Tell Them From Me* survey happen?

The surveys will be conducted in all participating schools at the end of Term 1 and (optionally) Term 3/4.

#### What is CESE?

The Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation (CESE) is part of the NSW Department of Education. CESE has been established to improve the effectiveness, efficiency and accountability of education in New South Wales. #### What is The Learning Bar?

The Learning Bar specialises in research-based design and facilitation of student assessments and survey solutions for both primary and secondary students. The in-house research team led by the President, Dr J Douglas Willms, undertakes extensive projects used in the school system to affect national policy. It is against this research that the survey, *Tell Them From Me*, has become the largest national school survey in Canada, used in nine of the ten provinces. Globally, more than 6,300 schools and 5.4 million students have participated in the survey over the last twelve years.

Dr Willms recently held the Tier 1 Canada Research Chair in Literacy and Human Development. He plays a lead role in the development of questions on student engagement for the OECD's Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA). For purely administrative purposes, *The Learning Bar* will also have temporary access to identifiable student responses to the survey questions. Other than *The Learning Bar* and CESE researchers within the department, identifiable student responses will not be disclosed to any other person or body other than as required by law.
