#### **Tell Them From Me Parent Survey**

This Term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted over Term 3 and early Term 4. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

### **Everyday Math Conversations**

In Term 3, all teachers across K-6 interviewed many students from each class to determine what level of understanding students had around numbers and place value. This varied across the years from some students still learning 1-10 and some students confidently using decimals. Last week, duringa data meeting, teachers revisited this initial data and were able to update student progress where possible.

A way that families can help to extend a child's understanding of numbers and place value is through everyday conversation that use math language and thinking. During routine activities, such as grocery shopping or cooking, point out numbers and quantities. For instance, ask your child to help you count items in the cart or measure ingredients. This not only reinforces number recognition but also helps them understand the concept of quantity and how numbers relate to real-world situations.


### SCIENCE:
