# STAGE 3 CAMP

Stage 3 students had a great week on camp. The aim of the camp was to provide students with a range of educational activities across a range of areas.

The first stop was Amberley Airforce Base where students visited the museum and saw a large collection of air force memorabilia including planes and helicopters. We then went into the city, had lunch at Southbank and visited the Maritime Museum. Here the students were able to enter a naval ship and see what the conditions were like. They also saw Jessica Watson's boat.

Day 2 saw us visit the Planetarium. Here we watched a movie projected in 3D onto the dome of the planetarium about the history of collisions in space. The afternoon activity was a swim back at camp and this was very much enjoyed by all.

Our third day started with a visit to the Port of Brisbane where we visited the information center and had a bird's eye view of the port. We then had a guided tour of the port, getting close to the boats being unloaded and some of the 1.6 million containers that arrive there each year. We visited the bird sanctuary included in the port and had a go at identifying different birds. The afternoon was a highlight for many with a visit to Suncorp Stadium. The behind-the-scenes tour concluded with students running out of the tunnel and almost onto the field (visitors are not allowed on the turf).

Thursday saw us going to St Helena Island. After a catamaran ride across Moreton Bay, the students visited the former convict settlement and learnt about the harsh conditions and punishment used on the island. After our return to the mainland, the students enjoyed some time in the park

Our final day included a visit to Parliament House. While we were there the new government were being sworn in, but this was happening outside of the tour area. Students learnt about parliament and participated in a mock bill. We then returned home.

While we were away, the students received several compliments on their behaviour with one member of the public saying that they are a credit to us. Even though it was a big week, there were lots of laughs and memories created.
