Tell Them From Me Parent Survey

This Term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted over Term 3 and early Term 4. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

LEARNING AND SUPPORT

Mrs Kuiters has been busy working with targeted Year 4 students in Quicksmart Literacy and Numeracy. All students have been working hard and making great progress this term.

She is also supporting students who have received learning and support referrals in targeted intervention sessions three times a week. Check out this learning in action!







MINILIT

Lisa has been working hard with her Year 1 and 2 students in Minilit. The Minilit early intervention reading program is supporting these students in their recognition of phonemes, graphemes and CVC words.

These students have improved the rate at which they can decode unfamiliar words and their confidence in doing this.

We love to see confident readers in Stage 1 building a love of books!





OUICKSMART NUMERACY

Year 4 students have been working hard in Quicksmart to improve their understanding and automatic recall of number facts and basic calculations.

The main aim of this program is to reduce the cognitive load required for these tasks, freeing up this space for new learning and more complex mathematical thinking. A variety of strategies are implemented to accommodate and differentiate for a wide range of learning styles.

Jen, Lisa and Mrs Kuiters have been thrilled to see the growth of students who started on addition, now working towards division!

YEAR 3/ YEAR 5 INTERVENTION

In response to the data from the 2024 NAPLAN tests, Ms Ritchie has been working with students in Years 3 and Year 5 to strengthen their understanding of targeted literacy and numeracy concepts.

Year 3 students were working on multiplicative strategies and exploring place value in numeracy. Comprehension and building vocabulary has been a focus for both Year 3 and Year 5 students, through exploring a range of text types to build their tier 2 and 3 vocabulary.

It has been wonderful to see these students build their confidence and enthusiasm for learning through intervention.
