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The Importance of School Attendance

Regular attendance has countless benefits for your child's learning and development. Parents play an important role in ensuring students get to school and stay in school every day. The more your child attends school the greater their opportunity to learn, create social connections and improve their wellbeing.

Building positive attendance habits

You can help build positive attendance habits by:

- helping your child learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- making sure your child arrives on time from the start of the school day, ready to take part
- reducing disruption to learning where you can, by planning any necessary appointments outside of school time
- contacting your school to explain any absences (within 7 days of the first day of any absence)
- making sure any holidays or medical appointments are taken outside school hours
- working with the school to encourage and support regular attendance.

Reasons for Missing School

Being Absent, late or leaving early:

- ⇒ If your child misses school for any reason, please contact the school within 7 days to explain why.
- ⇒ If your child needs to arrive late or leave early, please notify the school
- ⇒ If you have difficulty getting your child to school on time every day, please also contact the school. Our staff are here to support you and your child coming to school.

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
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Week 10 – Term 1 Newsletter

Hello to all the Sir Henry Parkes School family. In this newsletter article, I want to



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
tell you about the positive teaching that I have had the pleasure of doing in several classes over the past few weeks.

Have you ever thought about what is in a book? The Waves, Photons and Electrons classes had a lesson discovering that there is more to books than just words and pictures. In the reading and discussion of 'Parsley Rabbit's Book about Books', we discovered that words are read from left to right, pages can have numbers, books come in all shapes and sizes, sometimes with words and pictures, and sometimes with just one or the other. Some books have flaps to show bigger images, or the flaps can be used to hide then show something exciting. Books can make you happy or sad, make you laugh, or cry and you can share books with your family and friends.
