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SENTRAL PARENT PORTAL—A reminder to our families about the parent portal in Sentral. The letter that came home 2 weeks ago has log in and registration information for your family. Once you have registered, you will need the access key that is also in that letter. You will then be able to use the portal to record absences for your child/ren.

We also have the weekly newsletter uploaded in the portal. Our canteen menu and orders will all be done via the portal. Thus far, we only have 31 families who have registered. Please call the front office if you are experiencing difficulties with this.

EXCITING NEWS! We are working with the Tenterfield High School canteen to offer canteen to our students for one day per week. This service will now be available from NEXT WEEK! Fridays will be our canteen day, with the possibility of more days if we have enough families ordering through the THS canteen. Attached to today's newsletter is our menu. (There may be a few tweaks to this over the remainder of the term according to ordering)

We also now have an EFTPOS machine in the front office. This means we can now accept payments for uniforms, excursions etc with your card.

SCHOOL UNIFORMS UPDATE—We are continuing to add to our supplies of school uniforms. We now have in stock: School hats, navy unisex polo shirts, new design sport shirts, boys grey shorts, pullover winter jumpers and fleeces. Coming in the new few weeks we will have long grey pants for boys, long navy pants for girls, checked skirts and a restock of winter jackets. All pricings for our uniforms are the cost price. We do not make any profit out of these sales.

A reminder to our families to please ensure your child/ren are packing a school jumper in their bags if they are not wearing them to school. We have lots of kids shivering when they get here and we have a very limited supply of second hand jumpers to lend out.

CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT

Select Create New Account option. Your children will be automatically added to Student Pay Plus from THS Sentral for Parents data base.

ADD FUNDS

Click on the 3 dots, select the student, add meal funds. Enter the amount you wish to load & your card details & address. If you set the card as the primary billing account, the card details will be saved for future use. Click continue button.

CREATE CANTEEN ORDER

Step 3 & 4 is only required the 1st time. When the account is established, select the appropriate student, date of order, choose the menu items & add to cart. Provide any additional notes for the order, when correct click submit order. **9am is the cut off time for all orders.**



ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION REPORT



This semester I have really enjoyed working closely with the ES1 and S1 teachers and students. In the classrooms we have matched numbers to objects according to groups and enjoyed experimenting with symmetry through Pentominoes. Our journey, following *Sophie Scott Goes South*, to Antarctica was filled with awe and wonder about icebergs and penguins.

I have been very impressed with the wellbeing and care evident throughout the whole school. Every student is known and supported throughout their learning both in and out of the classroom. Breakfast club is an enjoyable experience seeing all the students greeted enthusiastically and encouraged to share toast and conversation with friends to start the day.

ES1 and S1 are continually working on further developing students' vocabulary knowledge leading to greater understanding of learning instruction and engagement in lessons. This is of great importance in everyday communication skills, reading skills and in achieving competence in writing.

Building Vocabulary at Home: A Key to Lifelong Learning

Helping children grow their vocabulary is one of the most important things parents can do to support their learning. A strong vocabulary helps students:

- Better understand what they read
- Express themselves clearly in writing and speaking
- Engage in conversations and classroom discussions with confidence
- Build the foundation for success in all subjects

How Can You Help at Home?

- Read aloud every day talk about interesting or tricky words in the book
- Play word games like "I Spy," rhyming games, or Scrabble
- Talk about new words during everyday activities (cooking, shopping, driving)
- Use rich, descriptive language don't shy away from "big words"
- Encourage curiosity if your child asks, "What does that mean?" stop and explore it together

By building vocabulary, you're helping your child become a confident reader, writer, and thinker. Even a few minutes each day can make a big difference!
