Crunch & Sip/Healthy Eating

Crunch&Sip is a set time in our school for students to 'refuel' on vegetables, salad and fruit and 'rehydrate' with water. Students who are not hungry and are well hydrated perform better in the classroom, show increased concentration, and are less likely to be irritable and disruptive. Many students are not eating enough vegetables and fruit or keeping sufficiently hydrated. This initiative is rolled out across NSW schools.

We have a lot of students in our school eating high amounts of processed and sugary foods in their eating times. Students eating healthy food is crucial for their physical and mental well-being, supporting growth, boosting immunity, and enhancing cognitive function, which ultimately leads to better academic performance and overall health. We really encourage our families to try to incorporate healthy food into lunchboxes as much as possible.

Literacy

Year 3 and 4 students have been enjoying our novel study 'The Thing About Oliver' this term. We are learning to retell the story from different characters' points of view. We are about to start a new book called 'Deadly Science: The Solar System' which we are so excited about as we love learning about space! Students are working hard in spelling too, focusing on a new grapheme or two each week. Year 4 are enjoying learning to write in cursive, while Year 3 perfect their handwriting skills too.



Maths

At the moment in maths, we are focusing on **place value** and solving **addition and subtraction questions up to 5 digits**. Students have spent some time creating their own word problems too and we are enjoying solving them together. This week, we will start a new unit all about

measurement and shape.

NAPLAN 2025 parent and carer information Suggested school newsletter or email content

Each year the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is sat by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Students will participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN 2025 will take place from Wednesday 12 March to Monday 24 March.

NAPLAN is just one part of our school's learning assessment program. The tests assess literacy and numeracy skills your child is already learning at school, so the best preparation is their everyday classroom learning. Our school will also undertake activities to help students become familiar with the types of questions and tools available in the online tests.
